

Join us for a Nuclear Weapons-Free, Peaceful, Just and Environmentally Sustainable World

April 24-26, 2015, New York City

The Ukraine crisis and the simulated U.S. nuclear attacks against North Korea remind us that the threat of nuclear war and annihilation didn't end with the Cold War. 2015 will mark 70 years since the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki; still, the nuclear powers possess nearly 17,000 nuclear weapons. We demand that when the world's nations gather in New York for the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty Review Conference they mandate the beginning the good faith negotiations to eliminate the world nuclear arsenals, as required by the Treaty.

U.N. General Secretary Ban Ki-moon and others have been clear that governments alone will not create a nuclear weapons-free world. Civil society and people's movement are essential to remove the nuclear threat to human survival. While the nuclear powers continue to resist implementing their Article VI NPT obligation to commence "good faith" negotiations for the complete elimination of their nuclear arsenals and ignore the requirements of humanitarian law, the vast majority of the world's nations are saying "Enough!" If non-nuclear States respect their Treaty obligations, so must the nuclear powers.

The International Planning Group for the 2015 NPT Review Conference is committed to:

- **Pressing the Review Conference to immediately, without delay, develop a time-bound framework for negotiating the total ban and elimination of all nuclear arsenals and for the four nuclear powers outside the Treaty to join these negotiations;**
- **Working to slash military spending, prevent wars, and fund human needs, especially with the nuclear powers "modernizing" their arsenals and delivery systems, led by the \$1 trillion committed by Washington. (A trillion is 1,000 billions!)**
- **Deepening the collaboration and integration of abolition, peace, justice, and climate change movements for long-term organizing.**
